

Village Trustee Candidates

The Spring Election is on April 3, 2018. Candidates are needed to fill any open seat(s) on the Board of Trustees. Interested persons need to file three forms with the village clerk by 5 pm January 2, 2018. The first is a Campaign Registration Statement stating the financing of the campaign, the second is a Declaration of Candidacy, and the third is a set of Nomination Papers. Nomination Papers require the candidate to gather 20-100 signatures from village residents who are eligible electors. The time period to circulate Nomination Papers is from December 1, 2017 until 5 pm January 2, 2018. You can pick up all three forms, as well as detailed instructions, at the Village Office.

Water, Sewer, Garbage, and Recycling Rates to Remain Unchanged for 2018

The Village Board has decided to leave the water, sewer, garbage, and recycling rates at the same levels as 2017. The water rate hasn't changed since 2014, the sewer rate decreased last year, and garbage rates increased \$0.50 last year due to cost increases.

Winter Parking Ordinance 451-23



No person shall park any vehicle on any street in the Village of Spencer between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. during the period from November 1 through April 1.

Snow and Ice Removal Ordinance 418-10

Removal from sidewalks. The owner, occupant or person in charge of any parcel or lot which fronts upon or abuts any sidewalk shall keep said sidewalk clear of all snow and ice. In the event of snow accumulating on said sidewalk due to natural means and/or by any other means, said sidewalks shall be cleared of all accumulated snow and/or ice within 36 hours if your lot is located in a commercial or institutional zoning district and 72 hours if your lot is in a residential district from the time the snow ceases to accumulate on said sidewalk. Sidewalks are to be kept clear of snow and ice to a minimum of four feet in width. In the event that ice has formed on any sidewalk in such a manner that it cannot be removed, the owner, occupant or person in charge of the parcel or lot which fronts upon or adjoins said sidewalk shall keep the sidewalk sprinkled with sand and/or salt to permit safe travel by pedestrians. The Board has the right to review any sidewalk concerns after a written request from property owners.

Snow and ice not to encroach. No person shall push, shove or in any way deposit any snow or ice onto any public street, alley, sidewalk or public lands dedicated to public use



except for parcels or lots located where existing buildings are constructed within five feet of the street right-of-way and the sidewalks exist from the Village right-of-way to the curbline. In such instances, the owners, occupants and/or employees of parcels or lots shall be permitted to deposit snow and ice from their sidewalks onto the public streets.

Holiday Fire Safety

For most of us, the holiday season represents a time for family festivities and good cheer. Few of us consider that the holiday season is a time when there is an increased risk of home fires. Fortunately, with a little added awareness and some minor adjustments to holiday cooking and



decorating, the season can remain festive and safe for everybody.

Cooking

Unattended cooking is the leading cause of U.S. home fires and home fire injuries. Most cooking fires involve the stovetop. Keep anything that can catch fire away from the stove and turn it off when you leave the kitchen, even if it's for a short period of time.

Candles

Candles are widely used in homes throughout the holidays, and December is the peak month for home candle fires. Two of every five home decoration fires are started by candles. We encourage



residents to consider using flameless candles, which look and smell like real candles. However; if you do use traditional candles, keep them at least 12" away from anything that can burn, and remember to blow them out when you leave the room or go to bed.

Trees



If you have an artificial tree, be sure it's labeled, certified or identified by the manufacturer as fire-retardant. If you choose a fresh tree, make sure the green needles don't fall off when touched. Before placing it in the stand, cut 2"

from the base of the trunk. Be sure to water your tree daily. Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit and is at least three feet away from any heat source. Use lights that have the label of a recognized testing laboratory and make sure you know whether they are designed for indoor or outdoor use. Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Never use lit candles to decorate the tree. Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed. After Christmas, get rid of the tree by placing it on the curb for collection by the Village.
